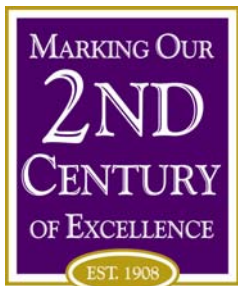

General Information:

The Bardstown City School district serves the children of Bardstown, Kentucky and the school boundaries extend approximately one mile beyond the city limits in most directions.

The district serves 2,728 students, pre-school through 12th grade. Bardstown City Schools has six school buildings on three campuses. The Primary School (K-2) and the Early Childhood Education Center (three and four-year-olds), are located on Templin Ave. The High School (9-12), Middle School (6-8), and Elementary School (3-5) are located on the main campus on North Fifth Street. The Alternative School is located at 6855 Louisville Road, Cox's Creek.

ACT Scores

In the 2009-2010 school year, Bardstown High School juniors scored an average of 18.5 on the ACT. The state average is also 18.5.

School Governance

Primary, Elementary, Middle and High Schools are all managed by a six (6) member Site Based Decision Making Council (SBDM). The SBDM Councils are composed of three (3) teacher representatives, two (2) parent representatives and the school's principal.

School Uniforms

The school dress code sets parameters for dress for all students from Early Childhood through 12th grade.

Technology

Personal computers are available in all K-12 schools at a ratio of one computer to every 3 children. All classrooms are linked directly to the Internet for on-line electronic activities.

Private Foundation

The Bardstown Foundation for Excellence in Public Education was established in 1985 to "take over where government funding fell short." Since its inception, the foundation has raised over a half million dollars for the school district.
